WHAT IS SINAPSE

SCIENTIFIC INFORMATION FOR POLICY SUPPORT IN EUROPE

- An electronic network accessible via the Internet.
- A new communication channel between the scientific/expert community and the policy makers, including the European institutions.



MAIN OBJECTIVES

- Better mobilise European scientific knowledge in support to policy making (one of the two key objectives of the EU RTD policy).
- SINAPSE is a practical tool to support the EU efforts to develop new forms of governance. It will facilitate the involvement of actors/stakeholders that at present can't be easily consulted or encounter difficulties to share their knowledge and viewpoint.

- Over 750 organisations are currently registered.




I — THE YELLOW PAGES

- A "Yellow Pages" section to quickly identify and contact scientists or scientific organisations with specific expertise.
- Users can on the basis of numerous criteria search for registered individuals/organisations with a specific profile or expertise.
- They also have automatic access to the members' visiting cards, including information on their activities and contact details (e-mail, website, CVs, etc).

II — SINAPSE WEB SEARCH

- SINAPSE will offer the possibility to perform thematic/focused searches in the members' websites.
- The objective is to increase the "visibility" of these information sources and to give access to some resources that are not yet taken into account by other search engines.
- The limited number of sources will increase **minimise** the "information white-noise".
- The user will be able to instantly get further details on the sources, and use filters to limit the results.
- The first phase is the collection of the web sources.

III - LIBRARY OF SCIENTIFIC ADVICE AND OPINIONS

- SINAPSE members (organisations) are invited to **upload scientific** advice/opinion they produced or requested.
- The advice reaches automatically potentially interested organisations and experts through a notification system based on the profile of the members (scientific and policy domains).
- The member uploading the document decides who will have access to the different elements of the document (title, short description, abstract and full text).
- In addition to the document itself, a description sheet includes meta data on who requested and produced the document, its likely impact, etc.



LIBRARY OF SCIENTIFIC ADVICE AND OPINIONS

- Offers advanced search functions, enabling for example to look for documents produced or requested by a certain type of organisation.
- The main objective is to **increase the dissemination** of scientific advice in order to increase its **impact**.
- Progressively, as the number of documents in the library increases:
 - serve as a basis for new advice, enrich advisory bodies work.
 - avoid unnecessary duplication of efforts.

IV- EC CONSULTATION

SINAPSE will offer to all Commission services the possibility to consult the members:

- Select appropriate sub-set of members on the basis of various criteria: domains of competence, type of organisation, location, etc.
- Possibility of getting centralised contribution from consulted organisations.
- Services will be able to design their own questionnaire and get automatic statistics on responses.



EC CONSULTATION

- Upstream or in support to existing scientific consultation mechanisms, such as committee meetings
- Tap into a larger knowledge reservoir. Give the possibility to experts not involved in the existing advisory system (participating in Committees or expert group meetings) to share their viewpoint and expertise.
- Get rapid feedback.



V - EARLY WARNING SYSTEM

- Whenever an issue necessitates or would benefit from the attention of the SINAPSE community (scientific organisation and public authorities).
- SINAPSE enables its members to **post early**warnings and to inform in one go all members with
 compatible interests and expertise, in view of
 facilitating a rapid mobilisation.



EARLY WARNING SYSTEM

- Such a tool will in particular increase the awareness of the competent actors regarding emerging issues.
- It will allow not only to better detect potential crisis but also to raise awareness and share observations or experiences that could be exploited on a European scale.



VI - COMMUNICATION AMONG MEMBERS

- The members of the network can make use of these communication tools to exchange information or initiate debates (e-mails, discussion groups, etc.). They can:
 - Decide who to involve at a first stage. Select the right sub-set of members based on their profile and competence.
 - Open or not the discussion (control the access).
 - Involve or not the Commission services.




COMMUNICATION AMONG MEMBERS

- As for the EC consultation tool, the organisations members of SINAPSE will have the possibility to launch structured debates based on a questionnaire that they are able to design themselves online (as well as get statistics on answers and import the results for further analysis).
- Members also have the possibility to set-up

 "Communities" of members sharing a common interest

 (within communities: libraries of documents and links,

 "message board", thematic discussions/surveys etc).






SINAPSE Communities

- Beyond the internal communication possibilities, one advantage of setting up a community in SINAPSE is the capacity to establish links with other networks/ organisations and to enlarge, if appropriate, the community to new relevant members who join the network and have compatible interest with the Community. (invite contacts and network).
- The members of the organisations already in the community have automatic access to the community if they register in SINAPSE.
- **Beyond** the community: the members can benefit and use the other SINAPSE tools and create for example specific communities with other organisations.



LIBRARY OF DOCUMENTS


• A library of documents organised in folders

• A library of links organised in sections/folders





MESSAGE BOARD


Sharing news and ideas

CALENDAR






NOTIFICATION SETTINGS

Can be restricted to specific folders.

Frequency of notification chosen by the users for each community module



By default, notifications are set to immediately for all folders.

SOME GENERAL FEATURES

- SINAPSE has been conceived to reproduce, as far as possible, the way people traditionally communicate. You are able to:
 - Decide and know with whom you communicate
 - Determine who has access to the documents you upload, discussions you launch, early warning you send, etc...
 - Filter what you receive on the basis of the sender.
 Decide to receive invitations to join discussions or emails from only certain types of organisations (e.g. public authorities)




SOME GENERAL FEATURES

- Members can be notified of new SINAPSE activities on the basis of their profile
 (scientific and policy domains of expertise and interest) and for each tool decide on the frequency of notification.
- Flexibility: the tools will evolve on the basis of the needs expressed by users; new functionalities can and will be added.

KEY TO SUCCESS

- SINAPSE offers a communication platform. Its usefulness will depend primarily on the capacity to reach the critical number of members.
- Importance of the current **registration phase** focusing on the **building** of the **SINAPSE community**. Registered members are invited to act as relays.
- Being a member does not imply regular active participation.
 One of the essential benefits comes from the use of the "yellow pages" function, which enables members to be contacted (if they so wish) or to contact other members whenever appropriate.
